



Recent changes have occurred at NARAL Pro-Choice Oregon. This past summer they assessed women's access to reproductive health care services across Oregon. It became clear reproductive health care must become an integral part of comprehensive women's care in Oregon.

At their Board and Staff Retreat in January 2009, they launched year two of their strategic plan that formally expands their focus to increasing access to comprehensive reproductive health care services, including contraception and pre-natal care. At the same time, **NARAL Pro-Choice Oregon Foundation changed its name to Oregon Foundation for Reproductive Health (OFRH)** to reflect a more expansive focus. With the name change and expansion of focus they have launched their **Prevention First Initiative**. The Prevention First Initiative has three components: increase access through contraceptive equity; increase access to emergency birth control; and increase access to affordable contraceptive services and supplies.

The next important step in this process is the implementation of the OFRH **Emergency Birth Control Access Project**. The project will include: 1) completion of statewide pharmacist outreach and education, 2) training other healthcare professionals and 3) provision of a statewide consumer education campaign.
